The European Affairs in the Croatian Parliament Bulletin is published monthly by the European Affairs Department. The Bulletin provides an overview of the Parliament's work related to European affairs and arising from the membership of the Republic of Croatia in the European Union.

The Croatian Parliament, as the national parliament of an EU member state, participates in the decision-making process at the European level by overseeing the activities of the Government in the European Union institutions and by exercising the powers conferred on national parliaments by the Lisbon Treaty.

Activities of the European Affairs Committee

In July 2022, the European Affairs Committee held one session:

At its <u>43rd session</u>, held on 6 July 2022, the Committee considered the <u>Czech Presidency of the Council of the European Union</u>. Ambassador of the Czech Republic in Zagreb H. E. Milan Hovorka presented five priorities of the Presidency.

Conclusion of the European Affairs Committee on European documents

The European Affairs Committee discussed and adopted conclusions on <u>D.E.U. br. 21/014</u> and <u>D.E.U. br. 21/015</u>.

Activities of other parliamentary committees

Other parliamentary committees discussed <u>European documents</u> in accordance with the Work Programme for the Consideration of the Positions of the Republic of Croatia for <u>2021</u> and <u>2022</u>.

EU documents Forwarded Directly to the Croatian Parliament

Pursuant to the Protocol (no. 1) on the Role of National Parliaments in the European Union, all draft legislative acts and communications are forwarded directly to national parliaments.

The Croatian Parliament publishes on a daily basis the EU documents received, along with information on the reference code assigned to each document, the applicable adoption procedure, its submission date and the timeframe for carrying out the subsidiarity check.

In July 2022, the EU institutions forwarded to the Croatian Parliament 39 documents: 17 draft legislative acts, and 22 communications and other non-binding documents.

Application of EU law

In July 2022, the Croatian Parliament enacted <u>11 laws</u> in the process of harmonization with European Union law.
