

# **LEVEL OF AMBITION**

Maintaining current level of Defence Budget in next three years Country defence with all available potentials and relying on collective defence Equippment and training for participation in operations NATO Capability Targets as a tool Participation in NRF and EUBGs

Land Force (50% deployable, 10% sustainable)

Air Force (40% deployable, 8% sustainable)



Maritime Force (protection of national interests at sea, possible participation in EU and NATO operations in Adriatic sea)
